


#### CONFIRMATION


### Sacrament of Reconciliation

## SUNDAY 7 MARCH 2021 THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT

## FIRST READING — Ex 20:1-17

## **RESPONSORIAL PSALM**

Lord, you have the words of everlasting life.

SECOND READING — 1 Cor 1:22-25

## GOSPEL — Jn 2:13-25

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

Destroy this sanctuary, and in three days I will raise it up. Just before the Jewish Passover Jesus went up to Jerusalem, and in the Temple he found people selling cattle and sheep and pigeons, and the money changers sitting at their counters there. Making a whip out of some cord, he drove them all out of the Temple, cattle and sheep as well, scattered the money changers' coins, knocked their tables over and said to the pigeon-sellers, 'Take all this out of here and stop turning my Father's house into a market.' Then his disciples remembered the words of scripture: Zeal for your house will devour me. The Jews intervened and said, 'What sign can you show us to justify what you have done?' Jesus answered, 'Destroy this sanctuary, and in three days I will raise it up.' The Jews replied, 'It has taken forty-six years to build this sanctuary: are you going to raise it up in three days?' But he was speaking of the sanctuary that was his body, and when Jesus rose from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they believed the scripture and the words he had said.

During his stay in Jerusalem for the Passover many believed in his name when they saw the signs that he gave, but Jesus knew them all and did not trust himself to them; he never needed evidence about any man; he could tell what a man had in him.

## REFLECTION by Fr Michael Tate Where does God really dwell?

The Ten Commandments are badly named. Rather, they are the Ten Responses which should characterise a liberated people, freed from slavery by 'the Lord, your God'.

By the time Jesus came on the scene, the Temple in Jerusalem was no longer a fit dwelling place for a God who desires to free people from oppression and exploitation. To the contrary, Jesus saw the Temple ideology as placing undue burdens and shackles on people. His anger at this erupted in dramatic street theatre. His overturning of the tables of the money-changers signalled the overturning of the Temple system.

What Our Lord revealed to uncomprehending authorities was that His body was the true sanctuary. The body of Jesus of Nazareth is the dwelling place of God, the habitation of the Lord God who liberates people. In short, God's sanctuary is not a place, but a person.

We could take a moment to pray, using the Ten Responses to review and guide our reflection and practice as we move towards Easter. This will help us to celebrate the enigmatic saying: 'Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it again.'

## FAITH FORMATION 2021 Session 1 Feedback

A couple of weeks back, we had 64 people registered to attend the first of our Faith Formation sessions with Fr Elio Capra. And wouldn't you know it, Covid brought another lockdown and we had to switch to Zoom. Still, we had 62 tune in with 2 apologies. What a great start!

Elio presented a session on *Sacramentality* and challenged us all to revisit our understanding of this concept from the viewpoint of becoming more contemplative of the creativity of our God. And challenge us he did. After the session, we posed a few questions to Elio, as a way to encapsulate the whole session, and he kindly offered his answers for our contemplation.

(Elio's answers in red)

- What would it mean for me to become a 'sacramental observer'? By the way, G.M. Hopkins use the word "beholder", which implies contemplation ('sacramental beholder'). The answer: It is an invitation to live in the presence of God throughout our daily life, by giving thanks and praise to God for what is happening and what we experience during the day.
- 2. What are some of the implications of being a sacramental observer (beholder) either as a parishioner or as a teacher? One of the implications is the quality of our prayer life. It would not be just a matter of saying prayers, but to develop a prayerful attitude towards what we experience in life. Our prayers would then begin to emerge from our life experiences. Our spirituality is not only centred in saying 'prayers' but it is a process of living our daily experiences in the presence of God.
- 3. How would we need to view and understand our frail and imperfect world? Our frail and imperfect world becomes a call to service ... to be the hands of God, the heart of God, the feet of God to the world. And this done with a deep sense of compassion and grace, because we know (at least Elio Knows) how frail and imperfect we are.
- 4. How would developing a worldview through the eyes of a sacramental observer (beholder) change/ transform the way we act? It would call us to a deeper sense of mindfulness and focus on our lives.... what we say .... what we do .... what we love etc. etc. It will also develop a deeper sense of gratitude in the sacramental beholder for the many blessings God bestows on us ... for the privilege and the calling to be able to live our lives as 'missionary disciples', despite our own faults and failures.
