GREETINGS FROM THE CAMINO TRAIL—FINAL UPDATE FROM FR LINH

This is my 5th and last Camino update before returning to Australia. As I pen these words, we are just 30 km out of Santiago de Compostela, the Camino destination. Now the mental focus has shifted from embracing the daily endurance of distance and heat to reaching for the final destination. There were days when I felt like I was in an unending marathon, but now I am beginning to wish that the whole Camino could be extended a bit longer, a kind of 'let us build three tents' feeling that we find in disciples of the Transfiguration story.

As the Camino destination is within reach, some pilgrims we have met are prepared to walk up to 50 km a day to meet the deadline, while others take their time and settle for a distance of 15 km per day. These pilgrims then return to continue or complete their journey at another time.

The last 100 km of the Camino has been full of pilgrims. The Camino rule is that one only has to walk the last 100 km to receive a Camino de Compostela certificate. So, gone are the days when we were able to walk in quiet and relative solitude. But solitude can always be found in the midst of a large number of pilgrims, usually in a lively surrounding.

Part of my day today was spent walking with a Spanish pilgrim. He could not speak a word of English, nor could I speak Spanish. But we managed to walk together side by side in peaceful silence, like two friends for a big part of the day. Only later did I find out (through Google Translate) that his name was Antonio. He was about my age, married with one adult son, and a grandfather who likes to walk the last 100 km of the Camino while his wife drives along the route and meets up with him at the end of each day.

It has been a wonderful and blessed experience. I am so grateful to have Paul as a Camino companion, later joined by his wife, Lynda. Our long walks each day often end with a beer or two to celebrate, and they have made this special time even more special.

I am now beginning to imagine the final day of our Camino journey: for many pilgrims, there will be a rucksack on their backs, legs limping, and lips singing songs of joy as we all head for the same destination. For those who are too weary to sing, at least our hearts are filled with joy and gratitude for the God who comes into our lives at different times during the journey and for the people we have met along the way.

Strengthened by the food, he walked to the mountain of the Lord.

Then he lay down and went to sleep. But an angel touched him and said, 'Get up and eat.' He looked round, and there at his head was a scone baked on hot stones, and a jar of water. REFLECTION by Fr Michael Tate Enwombed in the Maternal Christ

Your mother and my mother, carrying her baby in the womb for nine months, effectively said: 'Take, eat, this is my body.' A mother able to breastfeed continues this communion as she offers her body to give life to her child.

Our Lord Jesus Christ adopts maternal language to express his deepest desire for us! He gives us his risen and glorified Humanity: 'Take, eat, this is my body', and a sort of lifegiving mutual indwelling occurs: 'Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood abide in me and I in them.' This is as intimate as a baby dwelling in the womb of its mother. As St Paul put it in a different context, 'In Him we live and move and have our being.'

The Saviour of the World, the Conqueror of Death, dwells in my body and I dwell in his glorified body. This gives us 'eternal life' which is not something which begins after death, but is simply a label for Our Lord's Divine human life which we can share right now. However, because it is the life of the Conqueror of Death it will certainly impel us beyond the grave: 'The one who eats this bread will live *forever*.'

We could take a moment to pray to more fervently realise and take advantage of the fact that, at every Mass, we can respond to the invitation to come forward to Holy Communion so as to be enwombed in the maternal Christ.
