
### **FLOWER ROSTER**

### ROADWORK AT TORQUAY AND AT IONA COLLEGE

The roadwork has begun outside St Therese Church this week with the road completely blocked on our side of the road. This obviously requires extra thought when travelling to the Church as the only way to enter our carpark is via Zealy Bay Road/Service Road. Please ensure that the driveway in front of the Church remains clear at all times. You may drop off and pick up in the turnaround area, but parking in the driveway is not permitted. We need to keep this area clear for two-way traffic and for any potential emergency service access.

Charlemont/Armstrong Creek also has its own traffic woes, with **Parish Mass at Iona this Sunday 20th October**, parishioners are advised that the Boundary Road intersection remains closed in all directions. The best way to access Iona College car park is from Reserve Rd, and up Horseshoebend Rd or if coming from Warralilly/Armstrong Creek side, turn at Precinct Rd from Barwon Heads rd and again head up Horseshoebend Rd.




# CATHOLIC CHAPLAINCY AT UNIVERSITY HOSPITAL GEELONG. BARWON HEALTH.

On any given day, there is an average of 100 patients identifying as Catholic in the hospital. Around half of all patients identify with some religious tradition. St. Mary of the Angels parishioners provide for the services of a chaplain at the hospital as part of the Spiritual Care department.

Our chaplain provides Spiritual Care by supporting patients and families through access to the Sacraments, Holy Communion, coordinating a priest to visit, and End of Life care. The chaplain supports patients and families through prayer, and compassionate listening.

### Gospel Mark 10:35-45

The Son of Man came to give his life as a ransom for all.

James and John, the sons of Zebedee, approached Jesus. 'Master,' they said to him, 'we want you to do us a favour.' He said to them, 'What is it you want me to do for you?' They said to him, 'Allow us to sit one at your right hand and the other at your left in your glory.' 'You do not know what you are asking' Jesus said to them. 'Can you drink the cup that I must drink, or be baptised with the baptism with which I must be baptised?' They replied, 'We can.' Jesus said to them, 'The cup that I must drink you shall drink, and with the baptism with which I must be baptised you shall be baptised, but as for seats at my right hand or my left, these are not mine to grant; they belong to those to whom they have been allotted.'

When the other ten heard this they began to feel indignant with James and John, so Jesus called them to him and said to them: 'You know that among the pagans their so-called rulers lord it over them, and their great men make their authority felt. This is not to happen among you. No; anyone who wants to become great among you must be your servant, and anyone who wants to be first among you must be slave to all. For the Son of Man himself did not come to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.'

### REFLECTION by Fr Michael Tate Three Hummock Island

The sons of Zebedee expected Jesus to lead a Messianic revolt to throw off the yoke of imperial Rome. But they wanted to be part of a similar sort of power structure. They had not grasped that Jesus had come to turn that sort of society upside down.

However, over the centuries, the Church took on much of the trappings of power of imperial Rome. The popes governed much of Italy. Giuseppe Garibaldi was one of those generals who defeated the forces defending the Papal States, and in doing so actually liberated the papacy from its role as feudal overlord of much of Italy.

In the course of the campaign, when despondent, Garibaldi often reflected on the delightful time he spent on Three Hummock Island just off the coast of Tasmania. So we may say that the liberation of the papacy, enabling it to respond more clearly to today's Gospel, began in Tasmania!

Pope Francis embodies the spirit of today's Gospel. He rails against a Church exhibiting 'the leprosy of a feudal court'. Rather, he has said: 'I see the Church as a field hospital after battle. Heal the wounds, heal the wounds.' And in his actions he has shown himself as a true 'Servant of the servants of God' as Jesus commands in today's Gospel.

We may pause for a moment to pray for Pope Francis that he may have the strength and time to persevere in his responding to today's Gospel so that the papacy may be truly liberated so as to practise a radically different way of exercising leadership in the Church and for the world.
