
POPE'S MONTHLY INTENTIONS For mutual coexistence

Dear Parishioners,

On Friday August 8, the church in Australia celebrated the solemnity of our heavenly patron, St Mary of the Cross. Mass celebrated here on Friday morning was beautiful. It's hard to summarise the life of Mary because her enterprises were so vast, over so many states and in so many domains. Establishing convents, schools, orphanages, women's refuges, to say nothing of the countless individuals she helped and counselled. Her well-known quote of "Never see a need without doing something



roll up her sleeves and set about establishing schools for those that the State considered unworthy of educating.

Throughout her entire life Mary MacKillop fought tooth and nail to ensure that their order *never* received a cent of government money. This may seem strange to modern-day Catholics who are used to fighting *for* government funding. Mary understood with prophetic insight that the moment the government starts funding Catholic schools is the moment that Catholics lose autonomy over what they can teach. Currently, over two thirds of funding for Catholic schools comes from the government.

Reflection—Leo's Lens

'All creation', Pope Leo affirms, 'exists solely in the form of coexistence ... always interconnected.' While we might be lonely at times, none of us exists alone. We are all, always, part of something bigger. Focused on encouraging unity, the pope repeatedly calls for the Church to become ever more synodal – more conscious that we travel together. He wants us to 'recognise our own poverty and our riches,' allowing ourselves the grace to 'feel part of a greater whole.' None of us is saved alone. As the pope points out, 'even the most original and unique of charisms' – or gifts – will 'wither' if it is directed away from the community it is called to serve.

The pope calls us to follow 'the way of the Beatitudes, a path that we tread together, between the "already" and the "not yet," hungering and thirsting for justice.' He calls us to be 'poor in spirit, merciful, meek, pure of heart, men and women of peace.'

In this context, the pope shows us what spreading the Gospel really means. 'Evangelisation,' he says, 'is not our attempt to conquer the world, but the infinite grace that radiates from lives transformed by the Kingdom of God.' It is not you or me who evangelises, but the Spirit – taking each of us in our seeming ordinariness and changing the world.
