POPE'S MONTHLY INTENTIONS For mutual coexistence

Let us pray that societies where coexistence seems more difficult might not succumb to the temptation of confrontation for ethnic, political, religious, or ideological reasons.









Dear parishioners,

It has been rather sad and difficult this past week as tragic events unfolded in the Geelong region, in our state of Victoria and for those in our Catholic family abroad. On Wednesday, there was that terrible accident involving a school bus at Stonehaven that killed a young student from Christian College Geelong. A day prior, two members of Victoria Police were shot dead while executing a search warrant at a property in the northeast town of Porepunkah. And abroad, two school children died and 17 were injured as a result of a mass shooting at Annunciation Catholic School in Minneapolis, Minnesota. Such devastation and suffering.

It's a sobering reminder of the fragility of life and the reality that evil exists in our world. The crash involving the school bus was awful. For the loss of a young girl's life, for those injured and for all of their families. Also for those first on the scene of the carnage: many of them being parents from the school. The chaplain of the school, Aaron Cutter, has asked of our prayers for their community which I've assured him of. The other events are difficult to comprehend. Evil always is. I was having a discussion the other day with someone about the line between grave mental illness and demonic influence. It's not always clear cut. But if Satan is the father of lies as Our Lord tell us, then someone taken hold of so firmly with a paranoia and a belief that "the only good police officer is a dead one" (as Dezi Freeman did), then one can safely say that evil has overcome them. The shooter in the US had diary sketches of himself looking into the mirror and the devil looking back. There's evidence suggesting they were a member of an online group obsessed with mass killings and suicide. That they chose to shoot up a Catholic Church full of children makes the case there even more clear. Prayer can seem insignificant in the face of such events, but it truly is the greatest weapon. It strengthens faith and assures our hope. It is an act of charity, which has me call to mind of the words of St John of the Cross which are so simple yet beautiful: "Where there is no love, put love, and there you will find love". In Christ.

We are all fully aware of the human catastrophe that has been occurring since Oct



2023, and now getting even worse, in Gaza, the West Bank and Israel. You are urged to consider signing this:

Caritas Australia has launched an urgent public pledge calling on the Australian Government and international community to prevent a possible catastrophic drop in humanitarian aid to Gaza, where conditions are already life -threatening. New restrictive measures for INGOs, set to take effect on Sept 9, risk blocking critical assistance. While Caritas' partners are not directly impacted, the organisation highlights devastating consequences if aid decreases further. With over 60,000 lives lost, including 18,000 children, and the population facing starvation, the pledge calls for safe humanitarian access, a permanent ceasefire, protection of civilians, and hostage releases. Supporters are encouraged to sign, donate, advocate, and pray.
